
Reducing the number of travel lanes from 5 to 3 and providing protected bike lanes will follow FHWA's guidelines on best practices for road diets and the bikeway selection guide from FHWA's Separated Bike Lane Planning Design Guide. Providing protected bike lanes will increase safety and comfort for all travel modes on Central Ave.

The City of Baltimore reviews projects for ped/bicycle safety to ensure they meet the goals for the corridor and neighborhood. DOT also has a bike policy that reviews projects compliance with the Bicycle Master Plan and will install bike facilities if possible to create a multi-modal transportation system within the city.

Amendment: This amendment adds a new project to the FY 2022-2025 TIP. This project was originally listed in the FY 2016-2019 TIP. The City desires to modify the striping plan to provide better bicycle facilities and increased pedestrian safety/comfort by lowering vehicular speeds. ID. 12-1205-12** – The ongoing project titled **Central Avenue Phase II** (TIP ID 12-1205-12) in Baltimore City was included in the FY 2012-2015 TIP and is currently under construction. 

The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) requests on behalf of the MDOT State Highway Administration (MDOT SHA) an Amendment to the Baltimore Region's FY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add a new project.

This Amendment reflects the addition of the I-95/I-695 Interchange Bridge Deck Replacement project (TIP ID #63-2202-13). I-95/I-695 Interchange Bridge Deck Replacement (BRTB 63-2202-13) – This requested amendment reflects the addition of a new project to the FY 2022-2025 BRTB TIP. The project will add \$1,970,000 in design funding and \$25,000,000 in construction funding to the FY 2022-2025 BRTB TIP. The project includes replacing bridge decks with latex modified concrete deck overlays on 10 bridges within the I-95/I-695 Interchange, including over Sulphur Spring Road. In addition, the project will upgrade bridge parapets to meet current safety standards. MDOT SHA anticipates a total project cost of approximately \$27,200,000 million with construction in 2023-2024.

The attached Statewide TIP (STIP) report documents MDOT's requested amendment with respect to funding for the above project. MDOT is using toll credits to increase the share of federal funding for this project to 95 percent, reducing MDOT's matching funding obligation. This requested action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current STIP, which remains fiscally constrained. The amended funding does not affect the portion of federal funding programmed for transit or allocations of state aid to local jurisdictions in lieu of federal aid.

In addition, the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) remains fiscally constrained. The TTF supports State transportation system operation and maintenance, MDOT administration, debt service, and capital projects. Semiannually, MDOT updates revenues and expenditures using two national forecasting companies' latest economic estimates. The MDOT published funding details in the FY 2022-2027 Consolidated Transportation Program (http://www.mdot.maryland.gov/newMDOT/Planning/CTP/Index.html) and FY 2022-2025 Maryland STIP (http://www.mdot.maryland.gov/newMDOT/Planning/STIP TIP/STIPandTIP.html).
