PURPOSE OF MEMORANDUM

To request the MDOT OPPPD approve the following STIP amendment and notify the Federal Highway Administration - Maryland Division of this amendment.

ANALYSIS

MD 249 from Thomas Road to Stark Drive Drainage Improvement (SM1231) – This requested amendment reflects the addition of a new project and \$1,283,212 to engineering funding and \$5,265,414 to construction funding for SM1231. This amendment ensures the FY 2022-2025 STIP reflects the Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) updated programmed expenditures and project schedule in FY 2022-2025. SHA will use Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient and Costsaving Transportation Program (PROTECT) funds to convert the state funding component to federal funds. This is an SHA PROTECT Priority project and is eligible to receive 90 percent Federal funding with 10 percent State funding. This project's total cost, including funding programmed in fiscal years subsequent to and after, the FY 2022-2025 STIP, is estimated to be \$6.5 million. Design is underway and will proceed through Spring 2026. Ms. Michelle Martin Page Two

The attached STIP report documents MDOT's requested modification with respect to funding for the above project. This requested action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current STIP, which remains fiscally constrained. The modified funding does not affect the portion of federal funding programmed for transit or allocations of state aid to local jurisdictions in lieu of federal aid.

In addition, the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) remains fiscally constrained. The TTF supports State transportation system operation and maintenance, MDOT administration, debt service, and capital projects. Semiannually, MDOT updates revenues and expenditures using two national forecasting companies' latest economic estimates. The MDOT published funding details in the FY 2022-2027 Consolidated Transportation Program (https://mdot.maryland.gov/tso/Pages/Index.aspx?PageId=27) and FY 2022-2025 Maryland STIP (https://mdot.maryland.gov/tso/pages/Index.aspx?PageId=117).
