AMENDMENT TO THE 2025-2028 BALTIMORE REGION TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Baltimore region, encompassing the Baltimore Urban Area, and includes official representatives of the cities of Annapolis and Baltimore, the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Harford, Howard, and Queen Anne's as well as representatives of the Maryland Department of Transportation, the Maryland Department of Planning, the Maryland Transit Administration, and the RTA of Central Maryland; and

WHEREAS, the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board, as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Baltimore region, approved the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program for the Baltimore region at its July 23, 2024 meeting, with federal approval on August 8, 2024; and

WHEREAS, federal regulations require that all transportation-related projects must be listed in the approved Transportation Improvement Program with accurate funding schedules in order to be eligible for federal funding; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Program consists of projects included in, and in support of, the region's long-range transportation plan and ongoing short-range planning efforts; and

WHEREAS, the Maryland State Highway Administration (MDOT SHA) has requested approval of one amendment to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program through the approved Transportation Improvement Program amendment process; and

WHEREAS, MDOT SHA is requesting to amend the FY 2025-2028 TIP to add the Areawide Carbon Reduction Program. This amendment will add \$21.95 million in Carbon Reduction Program funds for planning, right-of-way, engineering, and construction in FYs 2025-2028 to support programmed project expenditures and project schedules. This project will provide improvements that reduce transportation carbon dioxide emissions such as traffic management, public transportation, pedestrian facilities, alternative fuels, and port electrification; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Program, as amended, continues to display financial reasonableness and re-affirms the appropriate project selection criteria whereby all requirements for a Transportation Improvement Program in the Infrastructure and Investment Jobs Act are met; and

WHEREAS, this project is consistent with the federal emphasis on performancebased planning and programming, specifically the federal requirements pertaining to transit safety and maintaining transit assets in a state of good repair; and

WHEREAS, the Interagency Consultation Group has determined that these projects are exempt according to the Conformity Rule (40 CFR Parts 51 and 93); and

WHEREAS, the proposed Transportation Improvement Program amendment was presented to the Technical Committee on January 7, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board, as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Baltimore region, approves the attached amendment to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program for the Baltimore region and finds them to conform to the applicable Maryland State Implementation Plan and requirements of the 1990 Clean Air Act Amendments.

PURPOSE OF MEMORANDUM

To request the MDOT OPPPD request BRTB to approve the following TIP amendment and, upon BRTB approval, notify the Federal Highway Administration - Maryland Division of the amendment to the BRTB FY 2025-FY 2028 TIP.

SUMMARY

The Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) hereby requests BRTB amend the FY 2025-2028 BRTB TIP to reflect the following action.

ANALYSIS

Areawide Carbon Reduction Program (BRTB 60-2501-09) – This requested amendment reflects the addition of a new areawide project to the FY 2025-2028 BRTB TIP and adds \$21,952,000 in federal Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) funds and matching funds to the FY 2025-2028 BRTB TIP for planning, design, right-of-way, and construction for BRTB 60-2501-09. This amendment ensures the FY 2025-2028 BRTB TIP reflects SHA programmed project expenditures and project schedules in FY 2025-2028.

The attached Statewide TIP (STIP) report documents MDOT's requested amendment with respect to funding for the areawide project above. This requested action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current STIP, which remains fiscally constrained. The amended funding does not affect the portion of federal funding programmed for transit or allocations of state aid to local jurisdictions in lieu of federal aid.

In addition, the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) remains fiscally constrained. The TTF supports State transportation system operation and maintenance, MDOT administration, debt service, and capital projects. Semiannually, MDOT updates revenues and expenditures using two national forecasting companies' latest economic estimates. The MDOT published funding details in the FY 2025-2028 Consolidated Transportation Program and FY 2022-2025 Maryland STIP.
