A Mid-County Transit Hub has been recommended to support the growth of Cecil Transit, enhance transit ridership, reduce stem miles and provide additional office space. The MidCounty Transit Hub will look to contain: a multi-modal public transit center to accommodate transfers and layovers, a kiss-and-ride facility, a covered area for customer waiting, pedestrian/bicycle connectivity and bicycle parking; a stand-alone Transit Administration facility containing Transit offices. This amendment will add \$800,000 in 5307 funds and \$200,000 in matching local funds for the land acquisition. FY 25 is the anticipated year of obligation for the funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Wilmington Area Planning Council does hereby amend the FY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program to include additional funding for the Cecil County Mid-County Transit Hub project.
