PURPOSE OF MEMORANDUM

To request the MDOT Office of Planning and Capital Programming approve and forward to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for its approval the following STIP amendment.

SUMMARY

The MDOT State Highway Administration (MDOT SHA) hereby requests amendment of the FY 2022-2025 Maryland STIP to reflect the following one action.

ANALYSIS

US 219, Chestnut Ridge Road (GA6463) – This requested amendment reflects a new phase of the larger US 219 corridor enhancement project in the FY 2022-2025 Maryland STIP and the addition of \$11,517,000 in new federal IIJA funding for planning and engineering. This amendment ensures the FY 2022-2025 MDOT STIP reflects MDOT SHA's updated programmed expenditures in FY 2022-2025. This project's total cost is \$84,930,000, and MDOT SHA anticipates beginning construction on this project in the Summer of 2028. This project is being advanced in collaboration with PennDOT and utilizing Appalachian Highway Development System funds.

The attached STIP report documents MDOT's requested amendment with respect to funding for above project. This requested action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current STIP, which remains fiscally constrained. The amended funding does not affect the portion of federal funding programmed for transit or allocations of state aid to local jurisdictions in lieu of federal aid. This project was funded as part of the \$900M+ in additional federal formula funding provided by IIJA over the previous federal transportation act and is a top priority project for Garrett County.

In addition, the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) remains fiscally constrained. The TTF supports State transportation system operation and maintenance, MDOT administration, debt service, and capital projects. Semiannually, MDOT updates revenues and expenditures using two national forecasting companies' latest economic estimates. MDOT published funding details in the FY 2023-2028 Consolidated Transportation Program
