PURPOSE OF MEMORANDUM

To request the MDOT OPPPD request WILMAPCO to approve the following TIP amendment, upon WILMAPCO approval, notify the Federal Highway Administration - Maryland Division of the modification to two areawide projects in the WILMAPCO FY 2025 - FY 2028 TIP.

SUMMARY

The Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) hereby requests WILMAPCO to amend the FY 2025-2028 WILMAPCO TIP to reflect the following actions.

ANALYSIS

Areawide Urban Reconstruction (WILMAPCO 3-5) — This requested amendment will add \$2,275,000 in state and federal funding in the design phase, \$1,270,000 in state and federal funding in the right-of-way phase, and \$1,500,000 in state and federal funding in the construction phase of this program currented funded for \$3,280,000 in the FY 2025-2028 TIP.

• Design: Add \$625,000 in state and federal funding to the design phase of FY 2026. Add \$925,000 in state and federal funding to the design phase of FY 2027. Add \$725,000 in state and federal funding to the design phase of FY 2028.

- Right-of-way: Add \$290,000 in state and federal funding to the right-of-way phase of FY 2026. Add \$490,000 in state and federal funding to the right of way phase of FY 2027. Add \$490,000 in state and federal funding to the right of way phase of FY 2028.
- Construction: Add \$750,000 in state and federal funding to the construction phase of FY 2027. Add \$750,000 in state and federal funding to the construction phase of FY 2028.

This amendment will increase the total areawide cost to \$8,325,000. This funding increase is necessary to accommodate the design, right-of-way, and construction (specifically for utility needs) phases of an urban reconstruction project on MD 222 from 2,500 feet south of High Street to Mill Street (CE4661) as part of this areawide TIP program.

The attached STIP report documents MDOT's requested amendment with respect to funding for the above project. This requested action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current STIP, which remains fiscally constrained. The amended funding does not affect the portion of federal funding programmed for transit or allocations of state aid to local jurisdictions in lieu of federal aid. In addition, the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) remains fiscally constrained. The TTF supports State transportation system operation and maintenance, MDOT administration, debt service, and capital projects. Semiannually, MDOT updates revenues and expenditures using two national forecasting companies' latest economic estimates. The MDOT published funding details in the FY 2025-2030 Consolidated Transportation Program (CTP) and FY 2025-2028 Maryland STIP.

RESOLUTION BY THE WILMINGTON AREA PLANNING COUNCIL (WILMAPCO)

AMENDING THE FY 2025-2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM, CECIL COUNTY ELEMENT

WHEREAS, the Wilmington Area Planning Council (WILMAPCO) has been designated the Metropolitan Planning Organization for Cecil County, Maryland and New Castle County, Delaware by the Governors of Maryland and Delaware, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation's (USDOT) Regulations of Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), Metropolitan Planning Requirements, require that, in air quality non-attainment areas, the MPO, in cooperation with participants in the planning process, develop and, at least every four years, updates the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

WHEREAS, the WILMAPCO TIP format incorporates a four-year period for the listing of priority projects to be implemented, as well as a list of program development projects; and

WHEREAS, the amendment to the FY 2025-2028 TIP has undergone appropriate community and technical reviews; and

WHEREAS, the amendment to the TIP has been determined to be air quality conforming in accordance with IIJA and Clean Air Act and Amendments (CAAA) of 1990 requirements; and;

WHEREAS, the amendment to the FY 2025-2028 TIP has been found to be financially constrained, as directed by 23 CFR 450.326, and consistent with the Regional Transportation Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Wilmington Area Planning Council does hereby amend the FY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program to include funds for the Areawide Urban Reconstruction project.
