We have completed our review of the State request (MDOT Control #25-6) to amend the Fiscal Year (FY) 2025-2028 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to amend four existing projects and to add two new projects in rural Maryland on behalf of the State Highway Administration (SHA).

- US 220 and MD 53 Intersection Improvement, Cresaptown (\$4.2M)
- I-68: US 220 to MD 639 – Rethinking I-68, A Plan to Reconnect Cumberland ((\$9,57M))
- Wildlife Crossings Pilot Program: Wildlife-Vehicle Collisions Planning Grant (\$387K)
- Roadside Pollinator Program: Pollinator Friendly Practices (\$143K)
- Local Agency Bridge Inspection Program (\$16.63M)
- MD 51, Old Town Road Bridge Replacement (\$102K)
