

# FORTY EIGHT DOLLARS Reward.

**R**AN away last night, from the Elk-Ridge Furnace, an Irish servant man, named **PATRICK REDMAN**, about 24 years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, much freckled and pitted with the small-pox, sandy colored hair, full face, has a hair mole on his left cheek, and a scar on his under lip: Had on and took with him, a half worn felt hat, of nabrigs shirt, old cotton jacket, also, supposed, a good grey or blue grey druggert ditto double breasted, with black horn buttons, and a pair of shoes with iron plates on the heels.

**THOMAS DUGLASS**, a dark mulatto boy, 18 years of age, a brisk lively fellow, about 5 feet 5 inches high, and keeps his hair nicely combed before: Had on and took with him, a small country made old beaver hat, new brown german serge coat with short turn-up cuffs, lined with brown shalloon, and suitable hair buttons, a jacket of the same, and breeches of the same color, but made of old cloth turned, a green flower'd damask jacket, new country made shoes, grey country made yarn stockings, striped silk handkerchief with an S and oilet worked in one corner, and perhaps the blue grey jacket described in the former part.
